

# LCRTOA Meeting Minutes

## March 2012

Call to order the meeting for LCRTOA at 09:05 Tuesday, March 13, 2012.

In attendance Rodney, Lintz, Mary-Lou Bush (phone), Chris Lake, Jamie Mason, Sue Reedy, John Shull.

Treasure's report: March bank states we have \$1,780.87. A bill for insurance for \$80 liability and a bill to CCom \$24.28 for using their conference calling service. Need invoices to all department's with students in the academy.

### **Old Business**

Rural Water Supply training, Chief Lake talked with Chief Crawford about how to accomplish regional training for a large water rural water supply evolution. DPSST has developed a rural water supply class that is available. Jamie will track down the actual curriculum. Also need a training plan for Strike Team Unit Leader for the county. This would help provide opportunity for training at this level.

Chief Lake reported that the Recruit Academy, so far, is going well from the instructors. Signed a letter of agreement with Portland Community College in regards to the academy. Seems all is well now with the Firefighter I Academy.

### **New Business**

RFOG/ Columbia County SOGs have adopted these for use by all the agencies in the county. There have been lesson plans developed by various Districts for these SOGs and would like to catalog these and determine if there are any SOGs that need lesson plans developed for. Once these are cataloged, we could put them in a library such as on the LCRTOA web site.

Chief Shull talked about The Metro RFOG group is reviewing the different SOGs and updating them. He indicated that the Highway Responses guideline and the Air Management guideline still applicable to Columbia County. The emergency communications guideline, working through the "orange button" guideline because of compatibility/ consistency issues (within the Metro areas), dividing the incident guideline, guidelines for searching IDLH structures guideline including air management and large area search with search rope bag and standardization of that search rope bag are all in process of review at this time. Rehab is the next to be reviewed by the RFOG committee.

Chief Shull stated the Metro Safety Officer's respiratory summit had a large discussion about metro area study on air quality around the IDLH incident. More to come.

### **Good of the Order**

Jamie Mason commented on DPSST's Self Rescue class in completed and ready to be distributed, WMD training is available through DPSST, OFIA Conference unofficially was successful, the "rubble pile" to be built at DPSST is delayed, Skid truck will be in Warrington in July, will make sure Columbia County has time spots. Will need the classroom portion before Districts can go to the practical part. Schedule time through Jamie.
